Learning Together in Year 5 – Summer Term



Powerful Monarchs- The Impact Enclosure and Ketts Rebellion

In the summer term, our learning is focused on the impact of land enclosures within Norfolk and how local landowner, Robert Kett, stuck up for the peasants, leading to a famous revolt in the 16th century.

Our Key Inquiry Question is:

How can one person make a big difference?

- About Robert Kett, a local gentleman, and how he attempted to make life better for the local people.
- About the uprising in Norfolk known as 'Kett's rebellion'.

Kett's Rebellion took place in the summer of 1549.


It started off in Wymondham after a small group of peasants got together to protest against rich robber barons who had stolen the common land, leaving the peasants to starve.



Led by Robert Kett, the peasants marched 10 miles into Norwich and gathered on Mousehold Heath, attracting the support of the poorer people of Norwich.



Michael Morpurgo has written many books, some set in Cornwall and some stories about evacuees during WW2. We have many of his stories in our class library for children to explore.

Michael Morpurgo says: I was born a really long time ago. 5th October 1943. In St Alban's in Hertfordshire, although I was evacuated to Northumberland when I was little with my brother, away from the bombs. Later, I went to primary school at St Matthias in the Warwick Road, then I was sent off to boarding

school in Sussex – the Abbey, Ashurst Wood. I was there for six years, hated being away from home but loved rugby and singing.
