

## Kett's Rebellion- How can one person make a big difference?

Throughout Year Five the overall Inquiry Question is: How can one person make a big difference? In the summer term the children learn about enclosure and the effect this had on the people living in England. They will consider how enclosure led to Kett's rebellion in Norfolk. The focus school values of **courage, accountability and kindness** are explored through the inquiry.

Summer Term	<p>Kett's Rebellion is the focus of the study:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Looking at the system of rule in early Tudor England and considering how this affected common people.</li><li>• Understanding how decisions made by one person can affect others</li><li>• Learning how land, food and resources were distributed in early Tudor England.</li><li>• Learning about the land use patterns in Norfolk at the time of the rebellion and the topographical features of Norfolk that influenced land use.</li></ul>
